- 5. The applicant shall ensure that the sign is maintained and repaired as necessary.
- 6. The sign shall not obstruct free and clear vision of vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- 7. The sign shall not interfere with or be confused with an authorized traffic sign, signal or device.
- 8. No further development, expansion or change in use is permitted unless approved by Leduc County.
