#### **BACKGROUND**

Annually, Road Operations obtains updated pricing for dust control products early in the year. This updated pricing allows us to ensure that we are charging the appropriate amount to deliver the service. When product supply costs increase, it becomes necessary to request a fees and charges amendment.

At the February 10, 2025 Public Works Committee meeting, the following recommendation was approved to adjust the fee for the residential dust control program.

**012-25** Committee member Doblanko – that the Public Works Committee recommend to Leduc County Council the following amendment to the cost of the residential dust control in the Fees and Charges Bylaw:

In 2024, Leduc County applied calcium chloride dust control at 463 locations across the municipality. To allow county graders to focus on their designated routes, Road Operations will be utilizing a contracted grader operator to support the dust control program.
